The Allegheny Grows Community Garden Program

Allegheny Grows is a program of Allegheny County Economic Development that encourages community and workforce development through urban farming and gardening. Through partnerships with Grow Pittsburgh and the Western Pennsylvania Conservancy, Allegheny Grows is a 2-year program that provides education, planning resources, materials and technical assistance for existing and newly developing community vegetable gardens in low-to-moderate income communities throughout Allegheny County (not including the City of Pittsburgh).

The program is beginning its sixth year and has thus far developed community gardens in the following municipalities: Millvale, McKees Rocks, Penn Hills, Bellevue, Wilkinsburg, Natrona, Clairton, Coraopolis, Homestead, and Mt. Oliver.

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Requirements and Eligibility

Allegheny Grows gardens serve low- to moderate-income individuals. In order to consider applying, your garden site <u>must</u> be Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) eligible.

There are two options for eligibility:

- 1. The garden site is located in a CDBG-eligible location (based on income). Please send proposed garden address(es) to us and we can determine eligibility.
- 2. If the garden is managed by an organization or institution that primarily serves low- to moderate-income people, you may be eligible. Contact Rayden Sorock or Dan Tobin if you have questions.

In addition, those groups that meet the following criteria will be considered for **Spring 2015** garden builds:

- 1. at least 6 organized and motivated gardeners in your garden group
- 2. a suitable site for gardening: a relatively flat and accessible space greater than 500 square feet that gets 6+ hours of sunlight a day and has the potential for growing healthy plants
- 3. written permission to garden on a lot that is owned by the municipality, the County, or a non-profit organization
- 4. an established organizational partner
- 5. the ability to install a municipal water supply at the site
